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

KULTUURIKATEL - Tallinn Creative Hub

Kursi 3, Tallinn 10415

The Creative Hub is situated in the heart of Tallinn, within walking distance of the Old Town, on the border of Kalamaja. Viru Gate and the Port of Tallinn are only a few hundred metres away. The distance to the airport is 6.5 kilometres.

The building of the Creative Hub was completed as Tallinn City Central Power Station in 1913. After a long hiatus, the stunning industrial complex was re-opened in 2015 as a renovated universal creative and event centre. This centre, which creatively blends the old with the new, was the venue of the main events held during the presidency of the Council of the European Union in 2017.

The Creative Hub is one of the most unique creative and event spaces in Northern Europe. The industrial interior of the complex has inspired legendary film-maker Andrei Tarkovski, and enchanted hundreds of other prominent figures. Approximately 300 events take place at the Creative Hub every year which are attended by 200,000+ people.



SOME FACTS ABOUT ESTONIA

- Estonia is located in Northern Europe
 - Total area 45,227 km²
 - In summer there is 19 h daylight
 - Over half of Estonian territory is forested.
 - More than one-fifth of Estonian farmland is certified organic.
 - Wildlife preserves comprise 23% of Estonia.
 - No point in Estonia is more than 10 kilometres from a bog.
 - There are 2,317 islands in Estonia.
 - Our air is the second-cleanest in Europe.
 - You can drink tap-water in every city
 - Estonia has one of the lowest population densities in Europe.
 - In Estonia, 99% of public services are available online 24 hours a day.
 - Estonia was the first country in the world to offer e-residency.

TALLINN OLD TOWN

Tallinn Old Town (Estonian: Tallinna vanalinn) is the oldest part of Tallinn, Estonia. The Old Town of Tallinn has managed to preserve its medieval and Hanseatic origin structure wholly. Old Town represents an exceptionally intact 13th-century city plan.

Since 1997, the area has been registered on the UNESCO World Heritage List. The Walls of Tallinn border the old town. Its area is 113 ha and there is a buffer zone of 2,253 ha.

The majority of the Old Town's structures were built during the 13th–16th centuries.
